ORDER REVOKING FOREIGN CERTIFICATES

By Order 98-8-24, issued August 20, 1998, we revoked for reason of dormancy the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Millon Air, Inc. (Millon), by Order 84-11-101, authorizing it to engage in domestic all-cargo air transportation.

By this order, we are revoking the certificates authorizing Millon to engage in foreign scheduled and charter air transportation. Instead of repeating our findings and conclusions in Order 98-8-24, we incorporate them here by reference.

ACCORDINGLY,

1. We revoke the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Millon Air, Inc., by Order 90-12-52, authorizing it to engage in foreign charter air transportation of persons, property, and mail.

2. We revoke the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Millon Air, Inc., by Order 93-4-3, for Route 608, authorizing it to engage in foreign scheduled air transportation of property and mail between the United States, on the one hand, and Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Panama Republic, Dominican Republic, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, and Paraguay, on the other hand.

3. We revoke the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Millon Air, Inc., by Order 96-10-2, for Route 713, authorizing it to engage in the foreign scheduled air transportation of property and mail between Miami, Florida, on the one hand, and Iquitos and Lima, Peru, on the other hand.

4. Unless disapproved by the President of United States under section 41307 of Title 49 the United States Code, this order shall become effective on the 61st day after its submission for section 41307 review or upon the date of receipt of advice from the President or his designee under Executive Order 12597 and implementing regulations that he or she does not intend to disapprove the Department's order under that section, whichever occurs earlier.¹
