This serves as notice to the public of the action described below, taken by the Department official indicated (no additional confirming order will be issued in this matter).

Application of Federal Express Corporation filed 6/29/99 to:

XX Renew allocation of five weekly round-trip fifth-freedom frequencies to provide the following service:

Scheduled foreign air transportation of property and mail between Subic Bay, the Philippines, and Hong Kong, in conjunction with Federal Express' services between the United States and Hong Kong.

DISPOSITION

XX Granted (subject to conditions, see below)

The frequency allocation was effective when taken: July 29, 1999, and will remain in effect, provided that Federal Express continues to hold the necessary underlying authority to serve the Hong Kong-Subic Bay market.

XX Award of the frequency allocation is consistent with the September 29, 1995 Memorandum of Understanding between the United States and Hong Kong.

Except to the extent exempted or waived, this authority is subject to the terms, conditions, and limitations indicated: **XX Holder's certificate of public convenience and necessity**

Conditions: Consistent with our standard practice, the frequency allocation granted is subject to the condition that it will expire automatically and the frequencies will revert to the Department for reallocation if they are not used for a period of 90 days.

Remarks: Federal Express is currently operating all five frequencies between Hong Kong and Subic Bay.

Under authority assigned by the Department in its regulations, 14 CFR Part 385, we found that (1) immediate action was required and was consistent with Department policy; and (2) grant of the authority was consistent with the public interest. To the extent not granted, we denied all requests in the referenced Docket. We may amend, modify, or revoke the authority granted in this Notice at any time without hearing at our discretion.

Persons entitled to petition the Department for review of the action set forth in this Notice under the Department's regulations, 14 CFR §385.30, may file their petitions within ten (10) days after the date of issuance of this Notice. This action was effective when taken, and the filing of a petition for review will not alter such effectiveness.
