ORDER DISMISSING APPLICATION

On March 20, 2000, Alaska Scenic Air, LLC d/b/a A Ball Air filed an application in Docket OST-2000-7102 requesting a certificate authorizing it to provide interstate scheduled air transportation of persons, property, and mail pursuant to section 41102 of Title 49 of the United States Code (Transportation). By letter dated May 16, 2000, the Department advised the applicant that additional information in support of the company's fitness was needed, and the company was given 30 days to provide the information requested. By letter dated August 3, the applicant was reminded that it had not furnished the required fitness information requested in our May 16 letter and was given an additional 21 days to file its response. The applicant was further advised that, if it failed to submit the required information within the allotted time frame, the Department would dismiss its application without further notice.

To date, Alaska Scenic Air has not filed the requested information in support of its fitness, nor otherwise notified us that it intends to furnish that information. Under these circumstances, we have decided to dismiss Alaska Scenic Air's application without prejudice to its filing a new application in the future at such time as it is prepared to fully prosecute it.

ACCORDINGLY, Acting under authority assigned by the Department in its Regulations, 14 CFR 385.12:

1. We dismiss, without prejudice, the application filed by Alaska Scenic Air, LLC d/b/a A Ball Air in Docket OST-2000-7102 requesting a certificate authorizing interstate scheduled air transportation of persons, property, and mail.
2. We will serve a copy of this order on the persons listed in Attachment A.

Persons entitled to petition the Department for review of this order, under 14 CFR 385.30, may file their petitions within 10 days of the service date of this order.

This order shall become the final action of the Department of Transportation upon expiration of the above period unless within such period a petition for review is filed or the Department gives notice that it will review this order on its own motion.
