**ORDER OF REVOCATION**

**Summary**

By this order, we are revoking the interstate scheduled certificate issued to Biz Jet Services, Inc. (Biz Jet) for reason of dormancy.

**Background**

By Order 2001-9-19, served October 1, 2001, the Department found Biz Jet Services, Inc., fit to engage in the interstate and foreign charter air transportation of persons, property, and mail and issued it an interstate passenger charter certificate authorizing such operations. By Order 2001-11-13, served December 3, 2001, the Department issued Biz Jet a companion certificate authorizing it to engage in foreign charter passenger air transportation. The effectiveness of these certificates was conditioned upon Biz Jet's providing us with, among other things, evidence that the carrier had obtained required FAA operating authority, evidence of appropriate passenger liability insurance coverage, and updated information on any changes it had undergone in its fitness.

Section 204.7 of the Department's Aviation Regulations (14 CFR 204.7) provides, among other things, that, if a carrier does not have its authority made effective and commence operations within one year of the date it was found fit, its authority is subject to revocation for reason of dormancy.

In Show Cause Order 2001-9-4, issued September 7, 2001, we called the company's attention to the requirements of section 204.7. In addition, by letter dated June 25, 2002, we reminded the carrier of the revocation-for-dormancy provisions of that rule. By letter dated August 7, Biz Jet, through its counsel, advised us that it no longer intended to operate under its certificates and did not object to the revocation of that authority. Under these circumstances, by this order, we will revoke the interstate charter certificate issued to Biz Jet by Order 2001-9-19. Revocation of Biz

Jet's foreign certificate authority is subject to Presidential review under 49 U.S.C. 41307 and will be handled in a separate order.

**ACCORDINGLY**, Acting under authority assigned by the Department in its Regulations, 14 CFR 385.12:

1. We revoke the interstate charter certificate issued to Biz Jet Services, Inc., by Order 2001-9-19 for reason of dormancy.
2. We will serve a copy of this order on the persons listed in Attachment A.

Persons entitled to petition the Department for review of this order, under 14 CFR 385.30, may file their petitions within 10 days of the service date of this order.

This order shall become effective and become the final action of the Department of Transportation upon expiration of the above period unless within such period a petition for review is filed or the Department gives notice that it will review this order on its own motion.
