

By notice of action taken, dated October 26, 2001, in the above docket, we deferred action on this application to the extent it requested authority to provide code-share services involving France. Subsequently, on January 22, 2002, the United States and France reached an open-skies agreement that permits the code-share services at issue here. Accordingly, we are now approving that portion of the captioned application.

This action is subject to the conditions attached to the notice of action taken, dated October 26, 2001, in the above docket. Persons entitled to petition the Department for review of this action under the Department's regulations, 14 CFR §385.30, should file their petitions within seven days of the date of this action. This action is effective immediately, and the filing of a petition for review will not alter its effectiveness.

* We continue to defer action on that portion of the application relating to Eurofly, pending advice from the Federal Aviation Administration under the Department of Transportation's code-share safety program guidelines. We also continue to defer action on the application to the extent that it includes code-share services involving Yugoslavia and Syria.
