Dear Mr. Briner:

This is in response to your letter dated November 5, 1998, regarding § 172.201(a)(1)(iii) of the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR; 49 CFR Parts 171-180). Specifically, you ask whether a shipping paper may have a column heading of "HM DG" (or some variation thereof), rather than a column heading of just "HM."

The shipping paper requirement in § 172.201(a)(1)(iii) specifies that a shipping paper, containing both a regulated hazardous material and a non-regulated material, may identify the hazardous material by placing an "X" in a column captioned "HM." The column heading you describe in your letter would not be in compliance with the HMR. The "DG" column heading is not acceptable because it would be the use of a non-authorized abbreviation and non-authorized code.

I hope this satisfies your request.

Monsanto Company is designing a single shipping paper for use not only in the United States but also in other countries. One of our offices in another country has requested that the "HM" column heading be changed to


HM

"HM" corresponding to "hazardous materials" and "DG" corresponding to "dangerous goods".

Please indicate if a column heading containing the letters "HM" on the first line and the letters "DG" immediately below it on the second line is in compliance with 49 CFR 172.201(a)(1)(iii).
